The Harewood and Overlea Homes

Inner County Outreach (ICO) is located in Harford County and provides two homes for male adolescents, ages thirteen to eighteen. One home is located in Harford in the town of Edge-wood and the other in Baltimore County in the town of Overlea. Although the homes are state governed, boys enjoy a family environment. ICO's President and Board Members see the boy's experience as a transition from a traditional, institutionalized environment to a more nurturing environment. Staff function more as nurturers than overseers and disciplinarians. The program provides twenty-four hour supervision to adolescents who may have experienced hospitalizations for various psychological and, or psychiatric conditions. Such conditions may include emotional disturbance, oppositional defiant disorder, developmental delay, and conduct disorders. ICO believes in the team approach and will incorporate all significant persons in the treatment process. To help foster growth and success, adolescents receive individualized treatment plans developed by the treatment team that focus on the adolescent's strengths, interests and needs. To learn responsibility, boys adhere to a structured point system from which privileges are earned. They also enjoy field trips to enhance their social development. A major challenge is to make certain that boys are prepared for the future. Our counselors motivate them to move forward to their next stage of life; for instance, boys can obtain a GED or enroll in a progressive program such as Free State Challenge. A Chief Executive Officer oversees the contractual compliance of the program; a Clinical Social Worker ensures treatment coordination; a House Manager supervises the day to day operations of the home; and trained child care workers ensure continued implementation of treatment plans.

What Do We Offer?

We offer an opportunity for youth to grow in a private, clean, structured, warm, less restrictive and more productive environment. Our residents benefit from the following services on an as needed basis:
